ENLISTED: THE KIDS OF CAMP DEFY 2018

At 0600, thirty 9-12 year olds awoke and began their rigorous weeklong leadership training process part of the Drug Education for Youth (DEFY) program. A joint venture between Operation Blue Shield, the USDOJ and the US Navy, Camp DEFY is a unique and comprehensive preemptive prevention program that seeks to build character, leadership skills and self-confidence in American youth who are exposed to the high-risk behaviors common to middle school students (i.e., guns, gangs, drug abuse, academic failure, delinguency and violence).

Upon completing the one-week residential leadership training camp at Fort Worth's Naval Air Station/Joint Reserve Base (NAS/JRB), these young men and women are paired with a mentor team consisting of active duty first responders and Naval personnel from NAS/JRB. The program is followed by a 10-month mentoring schedule designed to track their development and reinforce the skills, techniques and procedures that they initially learned in the training camp. The 10month program is followed by a graduation ceremony.



Each camper comes from a highcrime neighborhood in and around the DFW metroplex. Camp DEFY is uniquely positioned to equip each of these young participants with the skills necessary to change, not only their own futures, but the futures of their respective communities as well.

OBS is a proud partner of the USDOJ and the US Navy and is honored to sponsor Camp DEFY with the goal of providing valuable life skills training to every youth participating in the program.

PSN COMMUNITY UNITY FESTIVAL 2018

In a joint venture with the Department of Justice, Operation Blue Shield seeks to bring a new initiative to northeast Dallas that focuses on reducing gun and gang related violence. Project Safe Neighborhoods (PSN) is an intense, nationwide collaboration between local, state and federal resources aimed at reducing crime rates in target communities involving drugs and firearms.

On 25 August 2018, over 1,000 Dallas citizens met at Sam Tasby Middle School and participated in the PSN Community UNITY Festival, a part of the PSN initiative to build better and safer communities for everyone. Local law enforcement officers as well as federal agents from the Drug Enforcement Agency (DEA) and the Federal Bureau of Investigation (FBI) also participated. Everyone involved made a determined effort to strengthen the relationship between communities and first responders.

Citizens living in the community experienced unique opportunities to chat with law enforcement officers over a meal, see a DEA helicopter land on school grounds, snap a few pictures in the photo booth and take part in the Dunk-a-Cop booth activity (a crowd favorite).
