For instance, this month OBS and our wonderful team of volunteers have participated in the Dallas Police Department Northeast Division's Health and Safety Fair which served over 5,000 men, women and children. We celebrated an addition to the OBS/Community Learning Center located at Cielo Ranch Apartments (south Oak Cliff), and we watched thirty Camp DEFY children have fun as they learned how to play golf with two golf legends and Dallas Police Department Community Engagement officers.

Trunk and Treat: San Angelo, Texas

Finding a safe place for our children to enjoy Halloween while gaining a sense of trust for our First Responders has been a focus of Operation Blue Shield (OBS) – San Angelo. On October 30, 2018, Angelo State University Police Department and OBS hosted our 2nd Annual Children's Halloween Trunk and Treat event. Held on the parking lot at Angelo State University baseball facilities, first responders from multiple agencies brought their patrol cars, fire engines and trucks to the event and formed a Circle of Safety. Local businesses joined in the fun and showed their support for our local heroes and our community. OBS volunteers manned the games for the children and provided the 'treats' for our First Responders to 'pay forward'.

The line formed early and soon stretched from the parking lot to the street. Patient parents and costumed children got to meet and greet our local heroes. Parents used those moments to talk about safety and encouraged their children to trust the good men/women in uniform. Comments heard from the crowd were unifying. "If you are lost and need help, this is the person you find because they will help you." A young child dressed in a SWAT costume was surprised that the SWAT officers were "really real". Several young girls were impressed by the female officers dressed in their uniforms. More and more children were dressed in First Responder costumes, and we expect even more next year.



At the end of the evening, San Angelo's finest expressed their gratitude for the over 6,000 people who showed up to celebrate Halloween and meet a First Responder. When the community takes the time to say "thank you'" to a First Responder, the whole community benefits and neighborhoods grow stronger. Remembering that We're All In...This Together.
