OBS PARTNERS WITH DALLAS POLICE DEPARTMENT

On 10 November 2018, Operation Blue Shield was honored to participate and partner with the Dallas Police Department's Northeast Division at their 25th Annual Kids Health and Safety Fair, which was held at RISD Lake Highlands High School. The parking lot was filled with fun opportunities for children including a DPD SWAT vehicle, a Dallas Fire Department fire engine, bicycle safety sponsored by Bicycle Rodeo Safety Training, an Old School Car Show and an In-N-Out Burger stand which cooked and served for 1,800+ people. While the event itself was free and open to all, this years event focused on providing services for children with special needs.

Throughout the event, first responders and community volunteers gave away

children's coats, turkeys, games, bicycle helmets and other resources, including free flu shots as well as health and hearing screenings.

Operation Blue Shield facilitated the participation of the Lions Club Sight and Tissue Vision Van. Their doctors provided thirty five on-site eye exams and free glasses for these lucky children.

In Dallas, TX, there are 4,000 homeless people living on the street or in shelters everyday. A few years ago, the Dallas Independent School District (DISD) made the decision to offer free lunches for every child because of the sheer volume of children coming to school hungry.
