TRIALS TO TRIUMPH

Commander Chris Kishiyama (Kish) is the youngest of three children born to parents who were cocaine traffickers. As a child, he was unaware of this and thought nothing about seeing strangers passed out in the living room as he made a bowl of cereal and watched morning cartoons. He thought this was normal and every family did this.

At 12 years old, Commander Kish found the body of his brother who was an addict and had committed suicide. This tragedy was a wakeup call for his parents who immediately went into rehab but found their habit was hard to conquer. Although his father relapsed and overdosed once, his parents finally returned home ready to lead a better life. They became preachers and started a ministery dedicated to helping addicts.



At his father's one-year sobriety, a Drug Enforcement Administration (DEA) agent arrived at their home and informed the family that the agency had decided not to pursue criminal charges against the parents. Reason given: their hard work and dedication to helping others had saved the lives of several men, women and young adults. The compassion of the officer and his words of encouragement to keep the family unit together so they could help others turned the commander's life into a life of service.

Kickstart Kids | Operation Blue Shield is a strategic partnership benefitting youth school fitness curriculums. Created by Chuck Norris this character development program uses karate to empower youth core values, such as discipline and respect, to archive their greatest potential. The uniqueness of this strategic partnership program is the integration and participation of a first responder one day/week. This not only adds to a safer school environment but it provides positive interactions between the students, families and first responders. In addition, officers have an opportunity to earn karate certification and become actively involved helping America's youth.



Kickstart Kids black belt instructors teach character through karate and empower America's youth with core life values, i.e. discipline, honesty, respect, etc. so they can achieve their greatest potential. The weekly presence of a first responder interacting with the students adds to a safer school environment and supports better interactions between all parties.

Every community needs to take an active role in supporting the efforts of our teachers and our school districts. The Operation Blue Shield/Kickstart Kids model is a unique way for citizens and first responders to partner with a school and change the life of a child, their family and their community.
